## 2022 RIESLING ALBERT BOXLER \$55

sip of Boxler Riesling is a sensory journey through Alsace. Jean Boxler currently rules the roost at this humble yet incredibly exciting domaine, one of the region's most historic houses, founded in 1673. Intense and serious about his land, his craft, and his wine, Jean is the genius behind what are certainly some of the finest white wines in Alsace (and the world). After

World War II, Jean's grandfather became the first generation to bottle the family's production himself and commercialize it under a family label. Tasting through the entire range of Boxler's wines is ample proof of the fact that Alsace, along with Burgundy, is the source of the world's most complex, exciting white wines, and probably always will be.

This dry Riesling, with its finely etched aromas of exotic flowers, key lime, stone, and spice, exemplifies what the Boxler house style is all about: finesse, precision, and layers of flavor that couldn't come from anywhere else. —Dixon Brooke

Pairs well with duck & andouille etouffée, white lasagna with leeks & swiss chard, spicy coconut curry, or baked white fish.

## 2022 BOURGOGNE HAUTES-CÔTES DE BEAUNE "LE MONT ET FORÊT" PIERRE GUILLEMOT \$44

he Guillemot family has tended vines in Savigny-lès-Beaune for eight generations and produces wines with classic Burgundian finesse and balance, all the while preserving Savigny's rustic character. It's hard to imagine an established Burgundian domaine without a pure Chardonnay in its lineup, but the Guillemot family has never bottled one—until now!

Unlike their Savigny blanc, which



prominently features Pinot Blanc, this brand new cuvée from the Hautes-Côtes de Beaune is composed solely of Chardonnay, the region's principal white grape. There's a lovely balance of creaminess and toasted hazelnut with precision and minerality from its terroir, where vines grow in a cool and stony site above the Côte de Beaune. A great addition to the Guillemots' already steady lineup of Burgundies,

can be uncorked today to enjoy its youthful charm.
